Suggested Script (:30):

WHICH IS THE AMERICAN PREFERENCE TO TEST IF FOOD IS STILL EDIBLE - LOOK, TASTE OR SMELL? ACCORDING TO A NEW SURVEY COMMISSIONED BY EMERSON, THE SMELL TEST WAS THE OVERWHELMING FAVORITE, BUT 1 IN 4 RESPONDENTS ARE BRAVE ENOUGH TO TASTE LEFTOVERS TO SEE IF THEY'RE STILL GOOD. THE SURVEY ALSO FOUND 62 PERCENT OF AMERICANS DIDN'T REALIZE LEFTOVERS AND OTHER FOOD WASTE ARE PILING UP IN LANDFILLS. THIS IS DESPITE 72 PERCENT OF RESPONDENTS SAYING THE TRASH IS WHERE THEY THROW OUT THE INEDIBLE SURPLUS. ONLY 15 PERCENT SAY THEY USE THE IN SINK GARBAGE DISPOSAL, WHICH IS CONSIDERED MORE ENVIRONMENTALLY RESPONSIBLE.
